Good Food Balances The Scales of Justice

The past 2 years have illustrated the need for equitable, anti-racist, inclusive practices which ensure that historically marginalized populations have access, respect, and comfort in utilizing our agency's food services. The families that we work with are chronically impoverished, which means that our families are constantly under stress. The stress that families experience is from not having enough food, but also rent, safety, health and transportation. We know that individuals who experience these disparities in social determinants of health often have lower quality of life, less healthy days, more depression, substance use, poor mental health and even earlier death.

Good food should not only be a right, but a way to balance the scales of justice. This is why Friedens has made commitments now and into the future to center equity in our services. We launched a home delivery program, increasing access and equity for those who are not able to come to a physical location. We provide culturally appropriate food unique to the populations served at each location, which results in reduced food waste and increased satisfaction. We believe strongly in encouraging our guests to come and serve others in their community as an exercise in capacity building in work and life skills. We strive to be a space that is welcoming to the community we serve, reducing the effects of trauma. Whether it is a connection to healthcare, finding a job, or contributing service hours - our spaces are more than just food pantries. We call them community food centers where food is the focal point around which we nurture relationships, offer wraparound support, and build community capacity and leadership.

Come Grow with Us!

At Friedens it's our mission to build more inclusive communities through food, by honoring and incorporating the diverse cultures that make up the past, present, and future of our community. This summer one of our community beds is dedicated to corn, beans, and squash in honor of the Native American Three Sisters planting traditions. As we use our gardens for educational outreach, it's important for us to first reflect upon the lands on which our gardens were built. Milwaukee has been home to the Ojibwe, Potawatomi, Odawa, Oneida, Sauk, Menominee, Ho-Chunk, and Fox Indigenous communities. The Three Sisters concept is a companion style planting in which the beans will grow up and protect the corn stalks while replenishing the soil with nitrogen. The squash becomes a living mulch in which all three plants will thrive together.
